 distinguished two types of culture context

High context communication

Low context communication

 is one in which most of the information is already in a person, while very little is in the coded, explicit, transmitted part of the message. • is just the opposite: the mass of the information is vested in the explicit code.

 In high-context cultures, the rules, norms, and guidelines for various types of social encounters and very clear. Everyone well-socialized into the culture knows exactly how to behave in a variety of situations. In low-context cultures, all these questions lead to negotiations of one sort or another. Since there are no rules, people have to invest a great deal of time and energy in formulating ad hoc solutions. High-context communication, tends to occur in collectivistic cultures, and in these societies people expect more from others than do persons in low-context cultures. In the light of this theory, one can characterize American culture as law-context culture, whale Russian culture will be higher up the scale , but not high as Japanese or Arab cultures.
