Historically, members of the British royal family represented the monarch throughout the British Empire and held responsible and representative posts, today they perform ceremonial and social functions both in the UK and abroad, and in addition to the monarch, they have no constitutional role in government affairs.



Some facts

Very young princes and princesses, this rule also applies. Royal children travel in full readiness, like all adult family members.
