The poet William Drennan (1754 – 1820) first gave Ireland the nickname in his poem.







They still too weak to do it. Only when they are together with their pets and Little Mouse comes to help they manage to pull the turnip out.

The moral is – it's important to be friendly and helpful in the family, especially in difficult situations. Even a small effort (like a Little Mouse's) matters!
