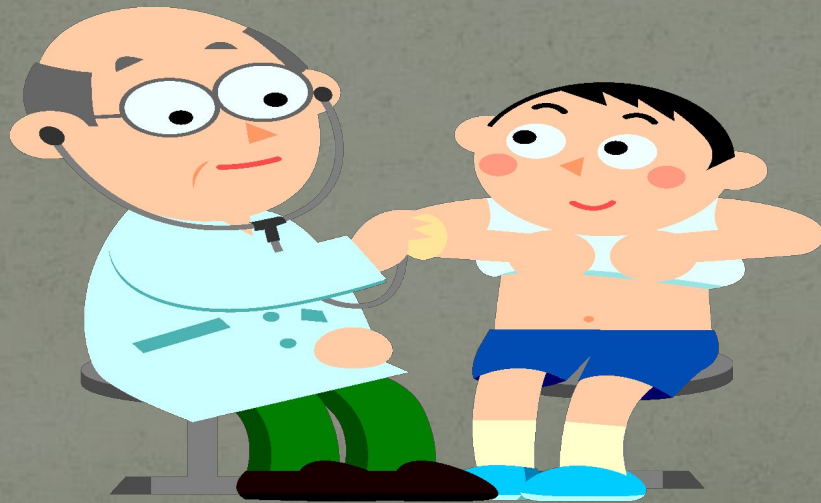

a nurse [nɜːrs] - медсестра

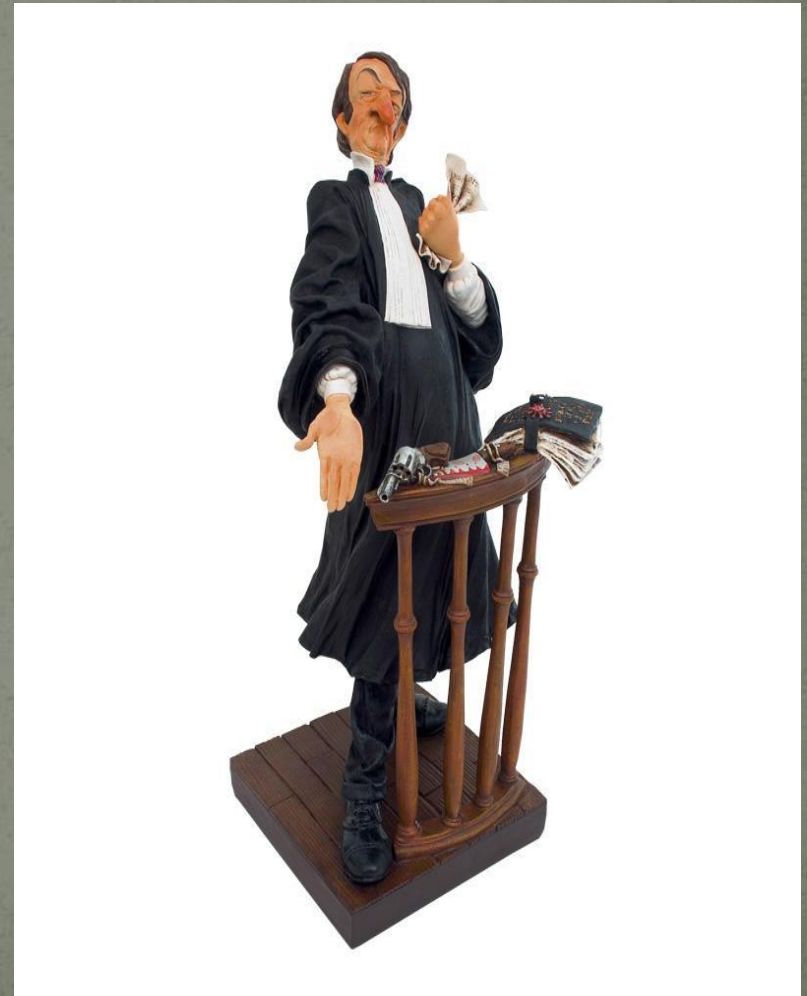




a guide [gaɪd] – гид, экскурсовод  
an interpreter [ɪn'tɜːprɪtə] – переводчик

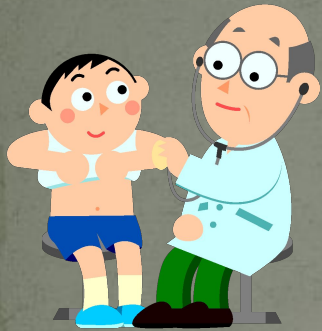


a librarian [laɪ'breəriən] - библиотекарь
