Much (много)- с неисчисляемыми существительными, не употребляется в утвердительных предложениях

Мапу(много) - с исчисляемыми существительными во всех видах предложений

Alot of (много) – как с неисчисляемыми существительными, так и с исчисляемыми существительные во всех видах предложений

Например:

- We don't need many apples. Нам не нужно много яблок.
- Do you have many friends? У вас много друзей?
- We don't have a lot of time. У нас не много времени.
- We don't need a lot of apples. Нам не нужно много яблок.
- **Do you have a lot of friends?** У вас много друзей? **I don't eat much butter.**—Я не ем много масла.
 - Do you have much time? У вас много времени?

К исчисляемым:

<u>How many?</u> - Сколько?
