

Essays providing solutions to problems are normally written in a **formal style**, and so you should **avoid** using **colloquial expressions, short forms or personal language.**

<i>formal</i>	<i>informal</i>
How do you do?	What's up?
It's a pleasure to meet you. Goodbye.	Nice to meet you. See ya (you).
I'm afraid your child is experiencing difficulty.	Your kid is making trouble.
Air consists of a variety of elements.	Air has all kinds a (kinds of) stuff in it.
it is not necessary for you to...	you don't hafta (have to)...
Entomology is a fascinating subject of study.	Studying bugs is like, really cool.
One grows weary in these matters.	I'm tired of this junk.
I agree with my colleague that...	Lily's right...
Please state your business.	Wha' d'ya (what do you) want?

The following essay takes a look at both sides of the argument.

*In the main body paragraphs we write our suggestions supported by possible results.
We write our suggestions in separate paragraphs.*






All things considered, ...
