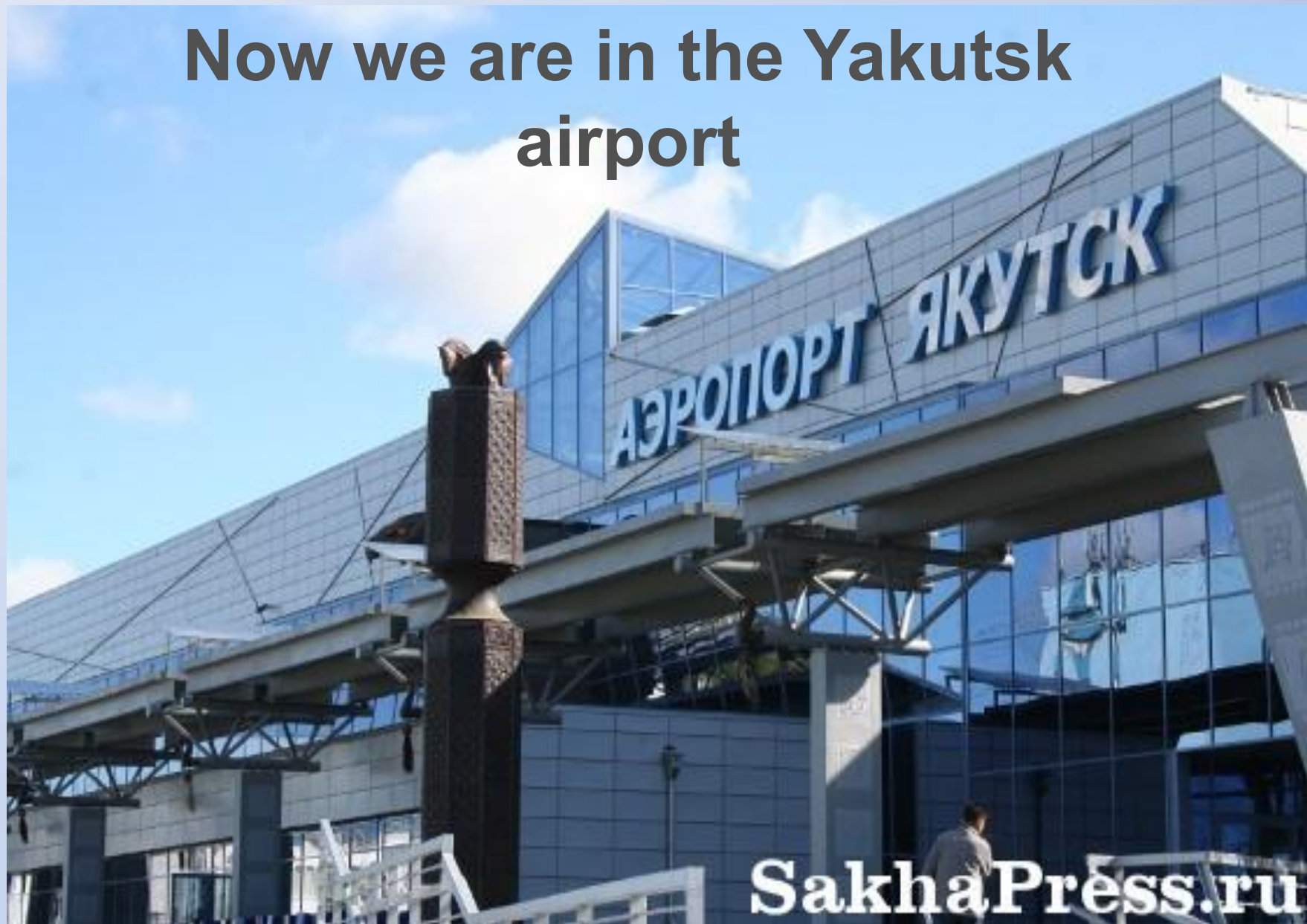

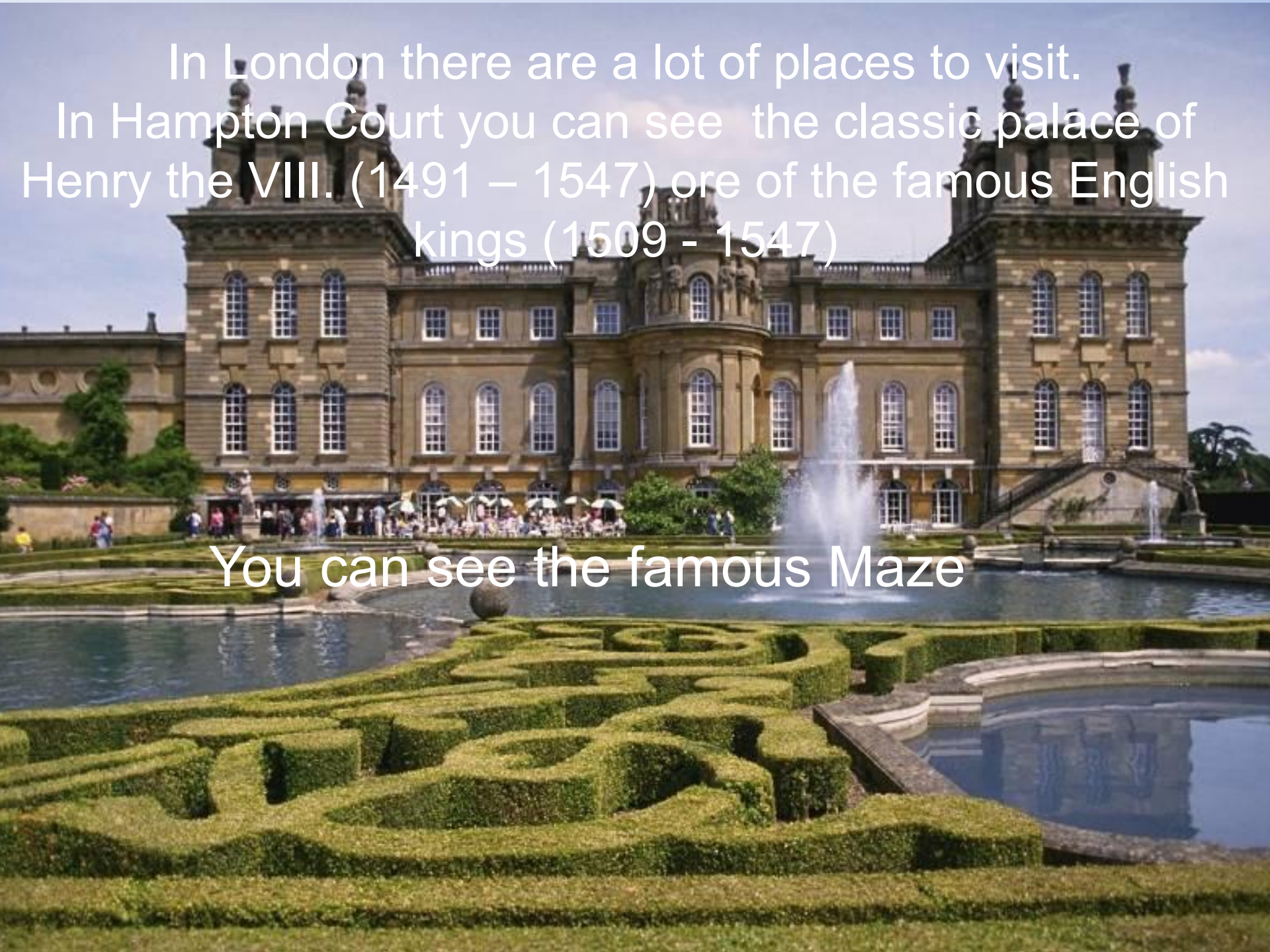


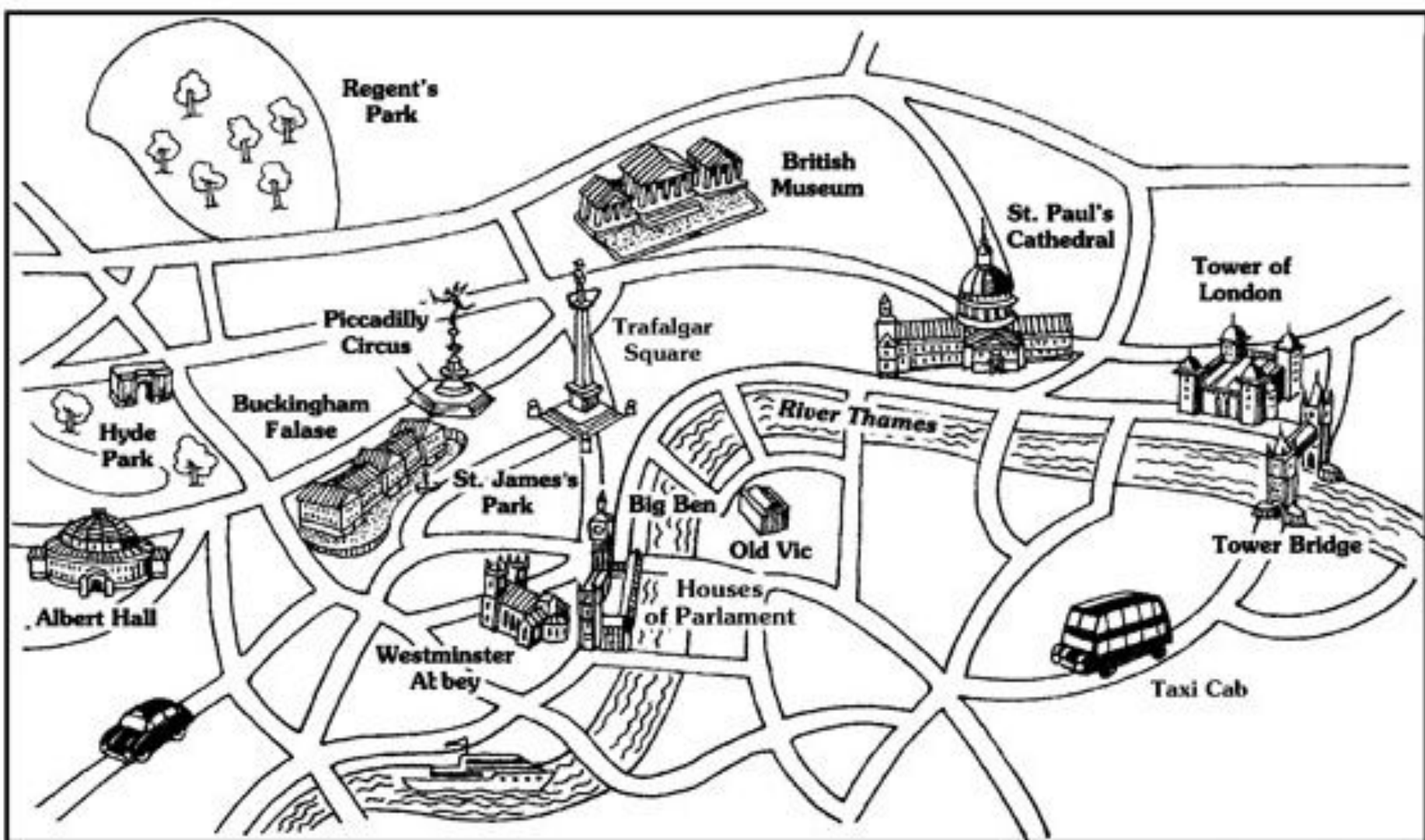
London is the capital of England. It is the biggest city in Britain. It stands on the river Thames. More than seven million people live and work there. It is a centre for business and for tourism.

The Tower of London

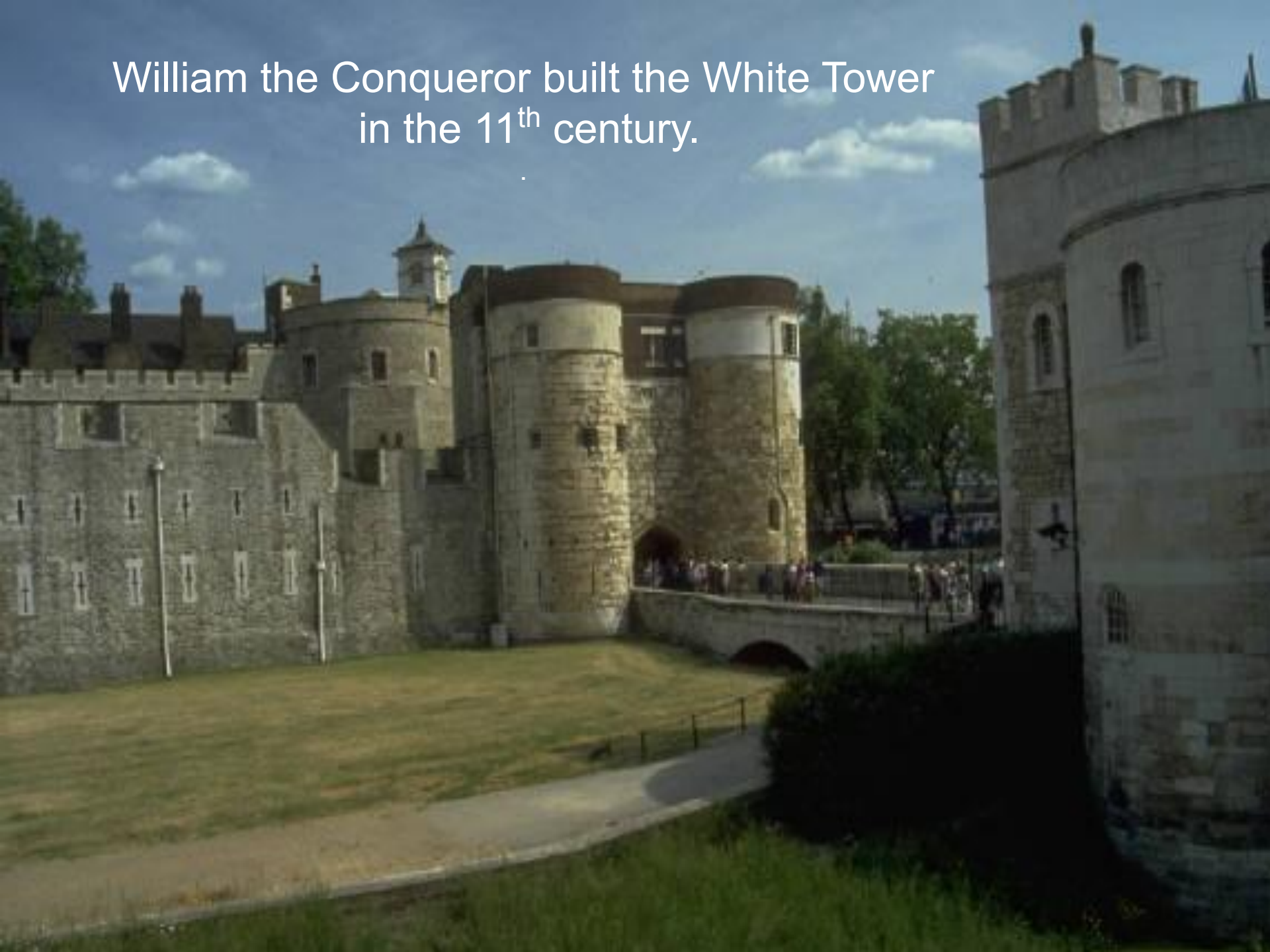


- The heart of London is the City. You can visit some interesting places in the city or near it. One of them is the **Tower of London**. It was a fortress , a place, a prison and king's zoo.

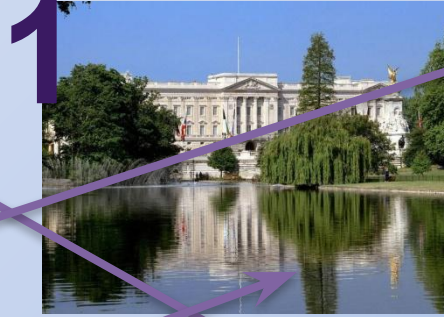
