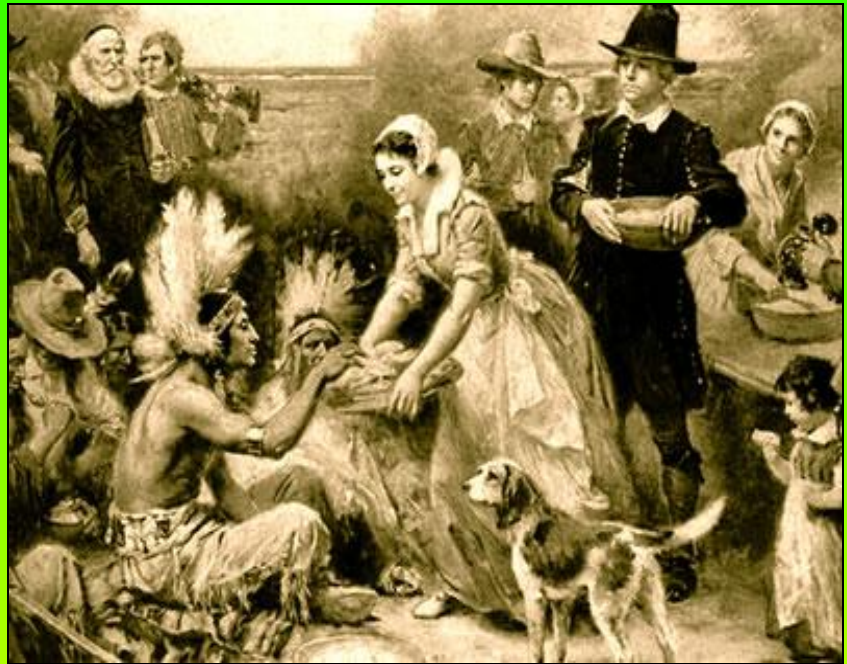

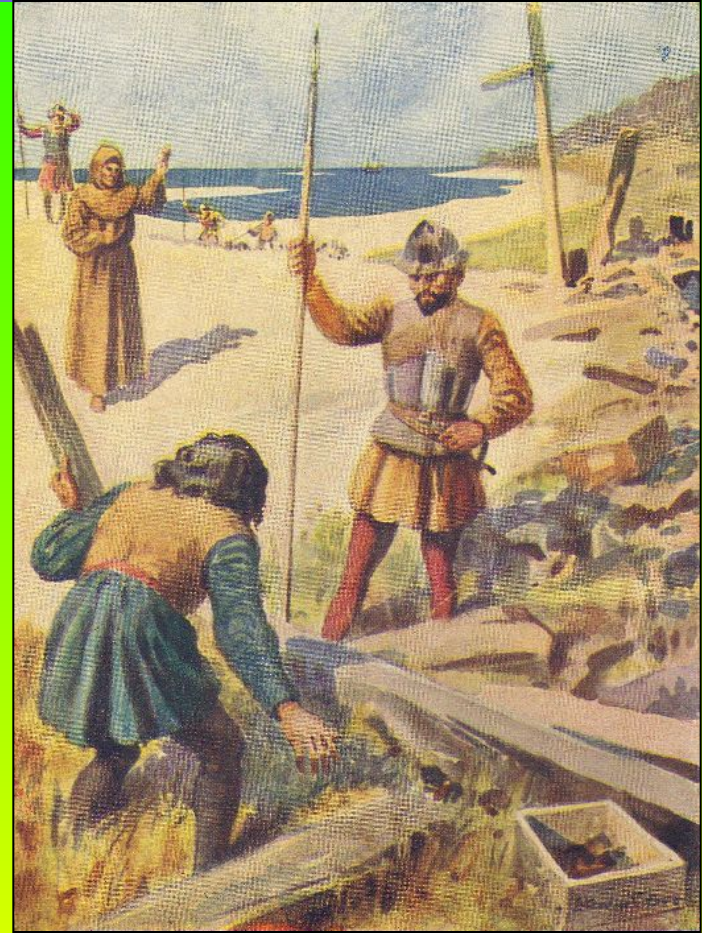
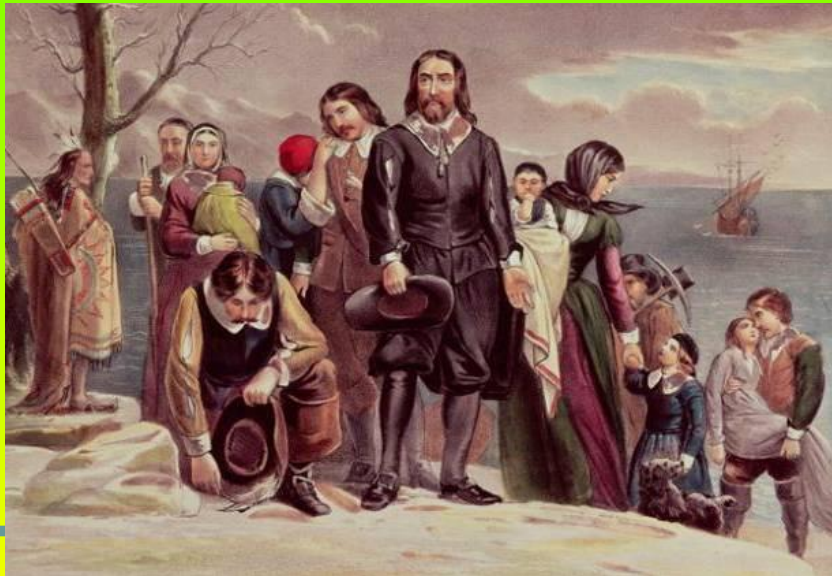
**People decorate their houses with fruit and flowers of autumn and prepare traditional American food: turkey, potatoes and pumpkin.**

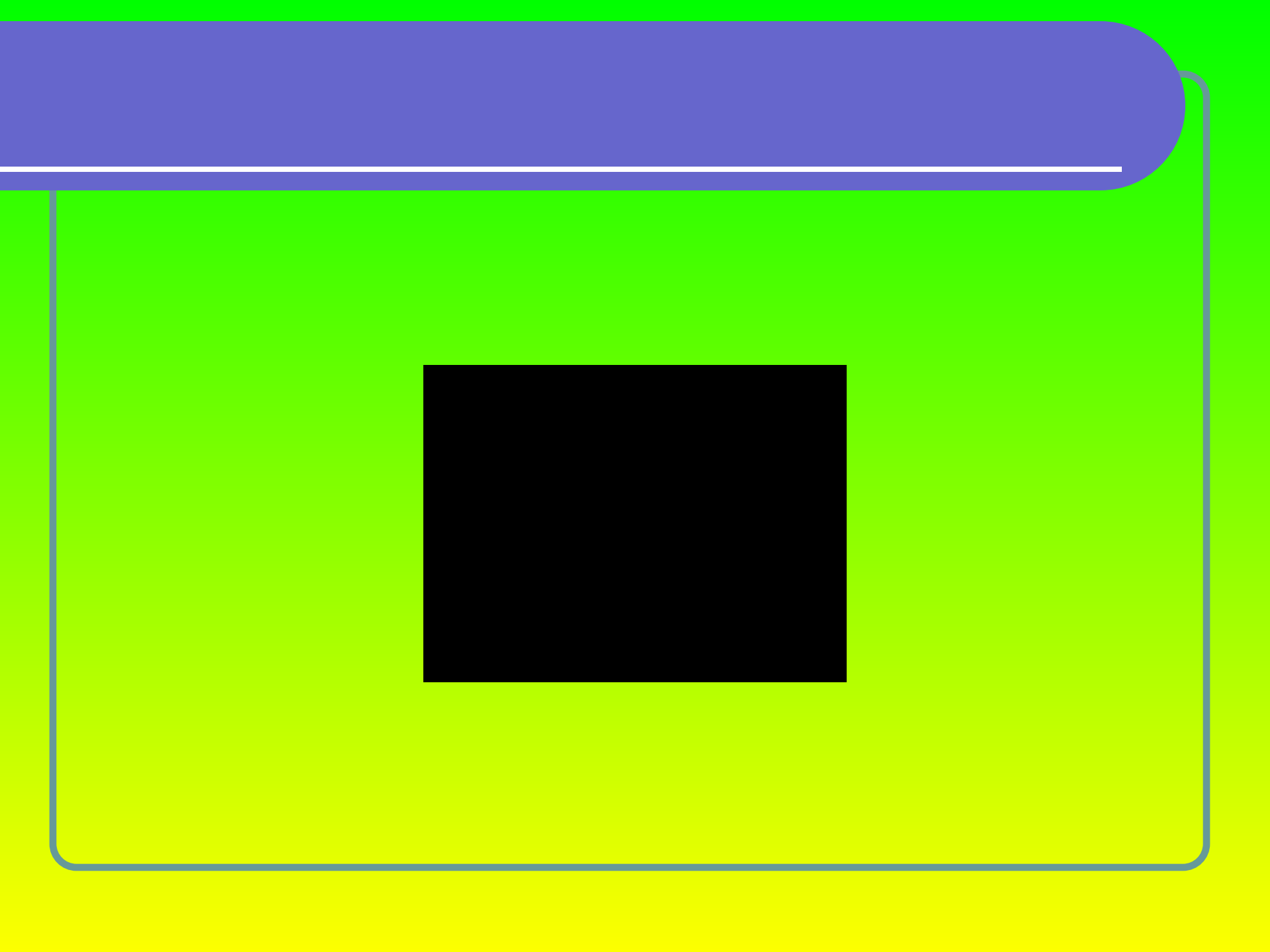




# HISTORY
