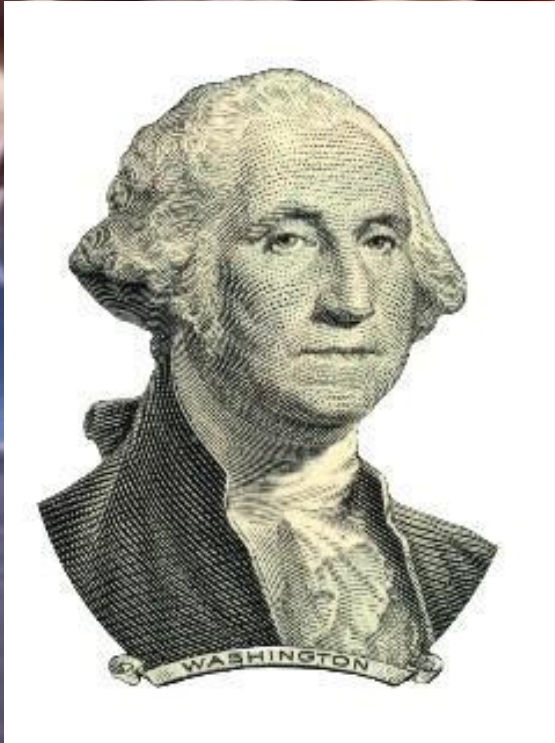

- It has the heads of Washington, Jefferson, Roosevelt, and Lincoln carved in the side of the mountain.

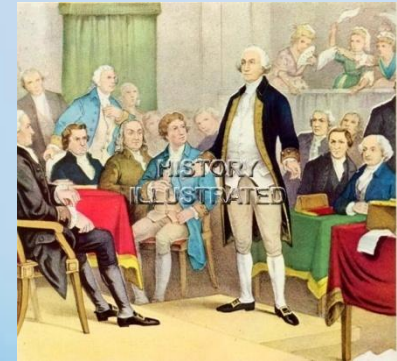
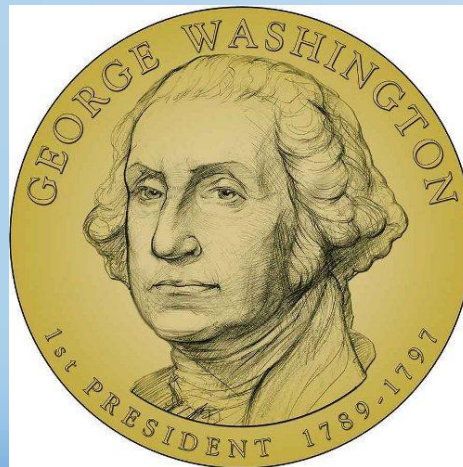
WASHINGTON MONUMENT

Fact 2:

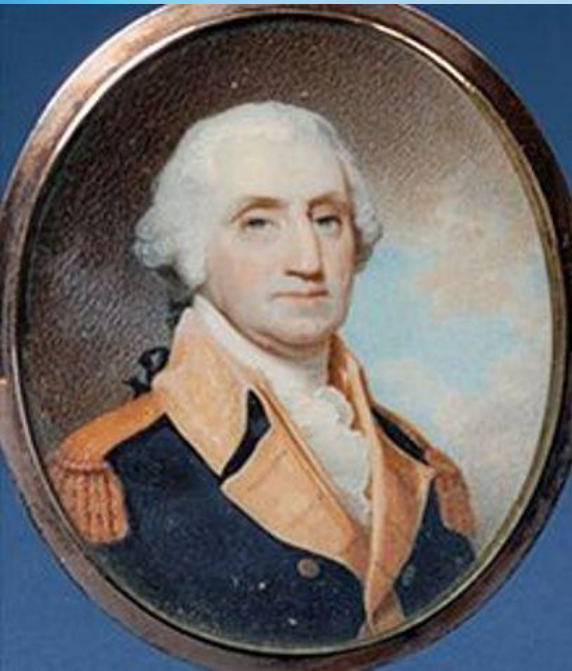
When George Washington had his position as the Commander in Chief for about 8.5 years, he refused to get the payment.

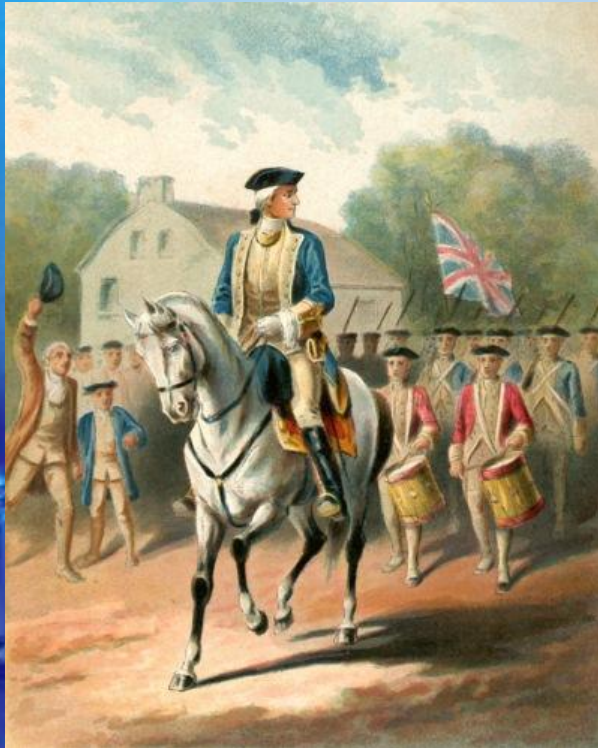
Fact 5:

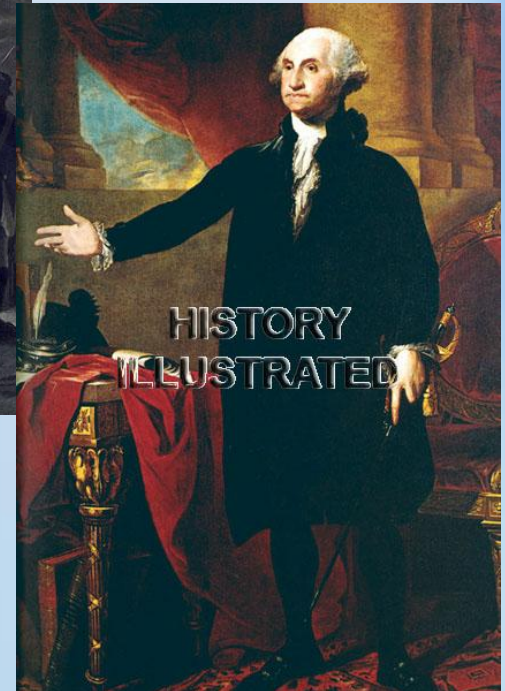
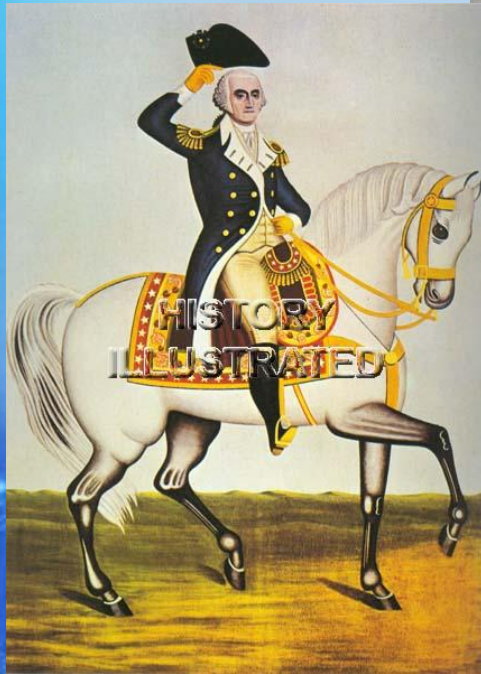

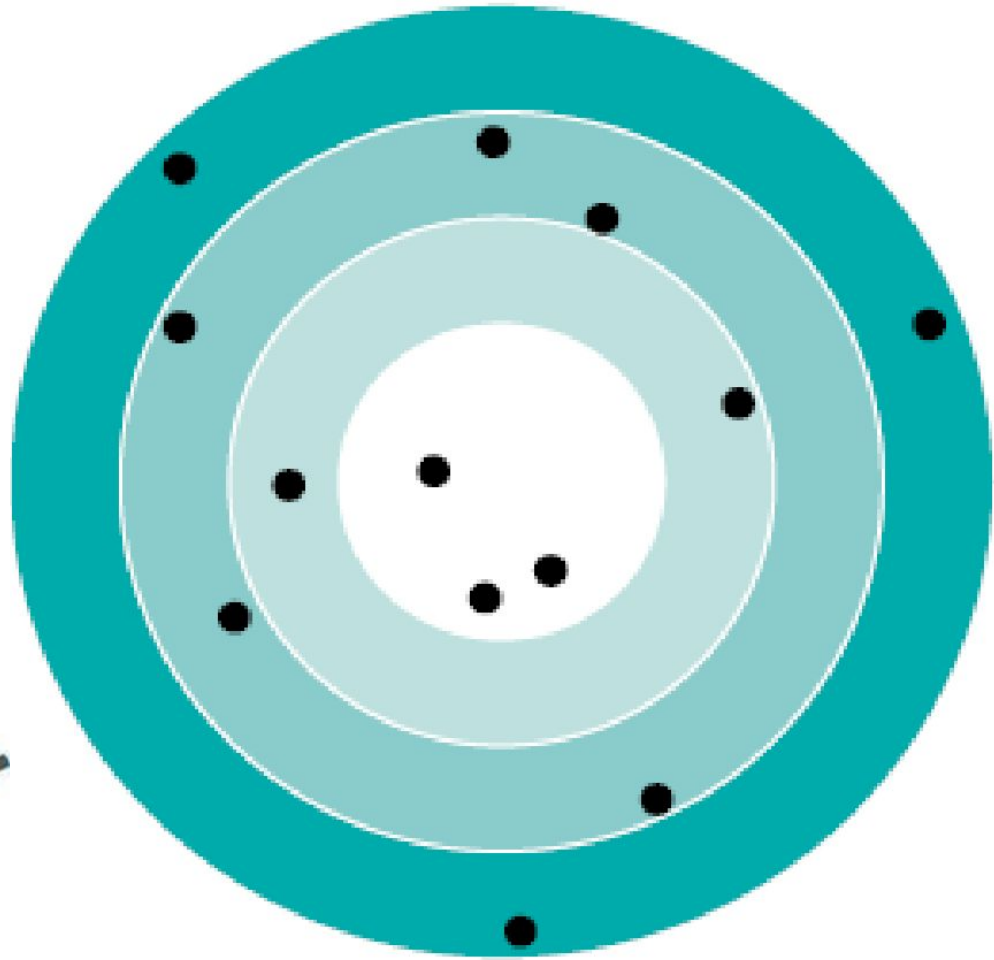
