

Abraham Lincoln

- He didn't quit and became one of the greatest presidents in the history of the USA.




Abe's childhood

The greatest example of persistence


- 1831- Failed in business
- 1832- Ran for state legislature- *lost*
- 1838- Sought to become speaker of the state legislature- defeated
- 1840- Sought to become electordefeated
- 1843- Ran for Congress- lost
- 1846- Ran for Congress again- this time he won- went to Washington and did a good job
- 1860- Elected president of the United States

A Great Lover of Poetry


His career as a statesman is well- known. Little known is that he was a great lover of poetry. His speeches and writings are filled with great and beautiful prose, but he wrote only three poems.
