Habits

I always drink coffee at work. She gets up at 7 a.m. every day. They usually eat dinner at home.





True in the present

He works on Wall Street. She is sixty years old. We live in New York.

General facts/truths

The Earth is not flat. The sun rises in the east. Water boils at 100 degrees C.



Future timetables/schedules

My train arrives tomorrow. We fly to Paris on Monday. Classes begin next week.



AFFERMATIVE FORM

- V (I, YOU, WE, THEY)
- My family and I <u>travel</u> to Britain every summer.
- I <u>love</u> listening to music.
- They visit their grandma on Sundays.
- Vs (HE, SHE, IT)
- He goes to school activities every Monday.
- The train <u>arrives</u> at 3 p.m.

INTERROGATIVE FORM

- DO + N (I, YOU, WE, THEY) + V?
- Do you like dancing?
- Do they live in our village?
- Where do your parents usually travel?
- DOES + N (HE, SHE, IT) + V?
- What does she do?
- When does the plane arrive?
- Does he feel well?

NEGATIVE FORM

- DO NOT (DON'T) + V (I, YOU, WE, THEY)
- I don't like dancing alone.
- They don't work on Mondays.
- DOES NOT (DOESN'T)+ V (HE, SHE, IT)
- She doesn't go shopping on Fridays.
- It never snows in summer
- It doesn't snow in summer.

PRESENT PROGRESSIVE

also known as present continuous

am/is/are + verb-ing **Happening Now** Remember: usually STATIVE VERBS It is raining. are NOT used in the progressive (-ing) form. I'm eating lunch now. **Longer Actions in** Temporary **Progress Now** Actions She's studying to be I'm working a doctor. in New York this week. He's training for a marathon. Fixed Plans (often in the Trends near future) More and more people are I'm meeting my using cell phones to access friends after work. the Internet.



INTERROGATIVE FORM

- AM +I +Ving?
- Am I really going to take part in this competition next week?
- IS + HE/SHE/ IT + Ving?
- Is it getting worse to live in your country nowadays?
- ARE + WE/ YOU/ THEY + Ving?
- Are they writing an essay at the moment?

NEGATIVE FORM

- I + AM NOT + Ving
- I am not going to help you tomorrow
- HE/ SHE/IT + IS NOT (ISN'T) + Ving
- It isn't raining outside at the moment.
- WE/YOU/THEY + ARE NOT (AREN'T) + Ving
- We aren't listening to each other these days.

STATIVE VERBS

- Глаголы чувственного восприятия: appear, feel, hear, look, see, smell, sound, taste
- He looks upset
- Глаголы, описывающие мыслительную деятельность: believe, forget, know, realise, remember, understand
- He doesn't know the answer to the question
- Глаголы выражающие чувства и эмоции: desire, detest, enjoy, hate, like, love, prefer, want
- Mr Smith wants to talk to you.
- Другие глаголы: be, belong, contain, cost, fit, have, include, keep, matter need, owe, own, weigh, wish
- I need to use your phone right now.

PRESENT SIMPLE

- I think he is nice. (думать, полагать)
- Tom has a motorbike (иметь, владеть)
- You can see the beach from my house (видеть)
- The soup tastes spicy (быть ... на вкус)
- This cheese smells strange (пахнуть)
- She appears to be having a great time (очевидным, должно быть)
- These shoes fit me perfectly (подходить по размеру)

PRESENT CONTINUOUS

- I am thinking of getting a cat (обдумывать, обсуждать)
- We are having fun at the party (проводить время)
- She is seeing her grandparents tonight (встречаться)
- Bob is tasting his salad (пробовать)
- Betty is smelling the flower (нюхать)
- Shakira is appearing in London this week (выступать, появляться)
- They are fitting the alarm system in their house (устанавливать)

I have had a cold for a week.

Event in the Past at an Unspecified Time

She has been to Paris.

I've seen that movie.

Repeated Events in the Past Until Now

We have had four exams so far this semester.

I've been to this restaurant many times since I moved next door.

has/have + past participle

Change Over Time

Your English has improved since the last time we met.

My niece has grown a lot in the past year.

Uncompleted Action that is Expected to Happen

She hasn't finished her homework yet.

They still haven't arrived.

* Often the present perfect is used in this way with stative verbs (verbs that are not used in the -ing form).

Duration in the past

He stayed up all night.

I lived in Paris for two years.



Habits in the past

Jen played the piano when she was a child.

Tom studied Spanish when he was a student.



Series of completed actions

He sat down, took out a notebook and pen, and started taking notes.

He made breakfast, drove his son to school, and went to work.
