## MODAL VERBS "CAN, COULD, BE ABLE TO"

- The House of Commons can make laws and discuss political problems
- The House of Lords can delay bills for one year
- When we went into the house, we could smell burning
- She spoke in a low voice but I could understand what she was saying
- My friend could speak 5 languages
- When Tom was 5, he could run 100 meters in 11 seconds

- The fire spread through the building very quickly but everyone was able (= managed) to escape
- They didn't want to come with us at first but in the end we were able (=managed) to persuade them
