**5<sup>th</sup> November**



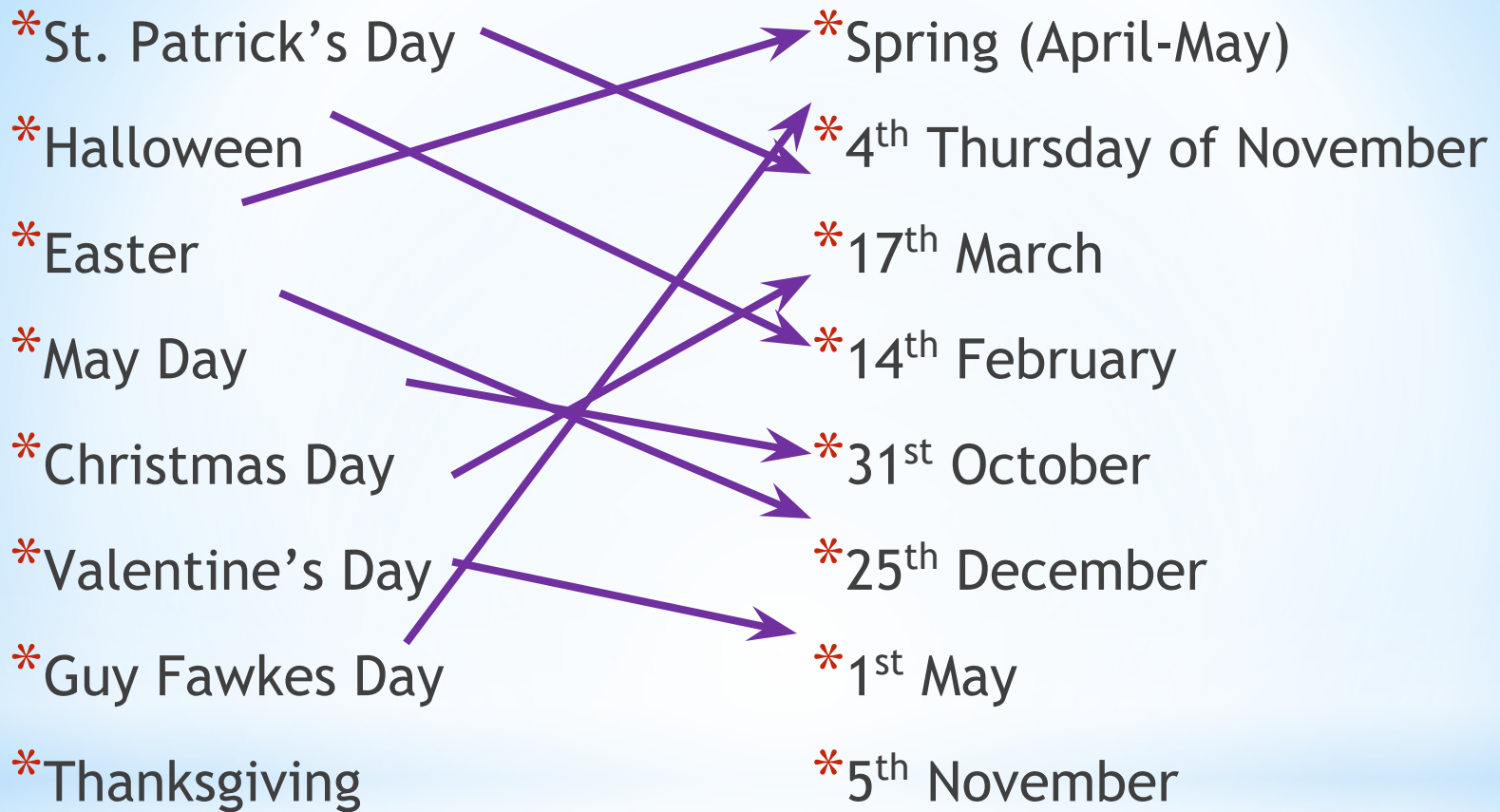
\* People like to bring together their relatives, giving thanks for all the good they had in this year.
