Joanne Rowling and Robert Galbraith — British writer, screenwriter and film producer, best known as the author of a series of novels about Harry Potter. The Harry Potter books have won several awards and have sold over 500 million copies. They became the best-selling book series in history and the basis for the film series, which became the third highest-grossing film series in history. J. K. Rowling herself approved the scripts of the films, and also became a part of the producers of the last two parts.



"Harry Potter" - a series of novels, written by the British writer J. K. Rowling. The books are a chronicle of the adventures of the young wizard Harry Potter, as well as his friends Ron Weasley and Hermione Granger, studying at the school of witchcraft and wizardry at Hogwarts. The main plot is dedicated to the confrontation between Harry and the dark wizard named Lord Voldemort, whose goals include gaining immortality and enslaving the magical world.



The main part of the Harry Potter series is a set of seven books about the battle with the villain Voldemort and his henchmen. In the seventh book of learning it is entirely devoted to the training of Harry and his friends to the final battle with Volan de mort and most of the battle. In the eighth book, events unfold 19 years after those described in the previous, seventh part of the Saga.
