PAST MEANING

Действие в прошлом

Past Simple

Past Progressive

Present Perfect

PAST SIMPLE

V2 (-ed), did

(+) Mother **made** pudding yesterday.

(-) Mother **didn't make** pudding
yesterday.

(?) **Did** mother **make** pudding yesterday?

OPEN THE BRACKETS

- ❖ Children (hang) greetings cards yesterday?
- ❖ They (not watch) parades.
- ❖ My family (gather) together last year.
- ❖ You (eat) cakes?
- ❖ Parents (wrap) presents.
- ❖ Did children hang greetings cards yesterday?
- ❖ They did not watch parades.
- ❖ My family gathered together last year.
- ❖ Did you eat cakes?
- ❖ Parents wrapped presents.



PAST PROGRESSIVE

was/were + V-ing

(+) Mother **was making** pudding at 5 o'clock
yesterday.

(-) Mother **wasn't making** pudding at 5
o'clock yesterday.

(?) **Was** mother **making** pudding at 5 o'clock
yesterday?

OPEN THE BRACKETS

- ❖ We (decorate) New Year tree from 5 till 7 pm yesterday.
- ❖ You (watch) a concert at 6 o'clock yesterday?
- ❖ Children (not choose) gifts all day long.
- ❖ My father (light) fireworks?
- ❖ My Granny (make) tasty meat.
- ❖ We were decorating New Year tree from 5 till 7 pm yesterday.
- ❖ Were you watching a concert at 6 o'clock yesterday?
- ❖ Children were not choosing gifts all day long.
- ❖ Was my father lighting fireworks?
- ❖ My Granny was making tasty meat.



PRESENT PERFECT

have/has + V3 (-ed)

(+) Mother has made pudding today.

(-) Mother hasn't made pudding today.

(?) Has mother made pudding today?

**Already, just, never, ever – после
вспомогательного глагола**

Yet – в конце предложения

OPEN THE BRACKETS

- ❖ Boys (already, raise) a flag.
- ❖ She (wrap) presents yet?
- ❖ We (not exchange) gifts yet.
- ❖ They (have) parties today.
- ❖ Pupils (just, wear) fancy dress.
- ❖ Boys have already raised a flag.
- ❖ Has she wrapped presents yet?
- ❖ We have not exchanged gifts yet.
- ❖ They have had parties today.
- ❖ Pupils have just worn fancy dress.
