- *to organize and develop the communicative abilities*



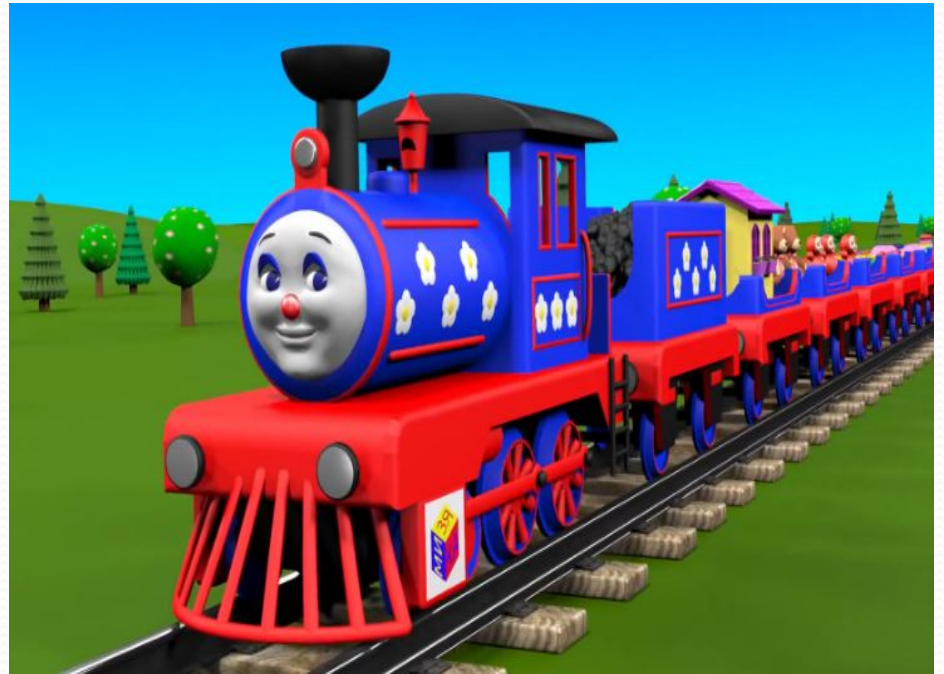
The motto of the Lesson:
