If the water is not filtered, it is dangerous for our health.

If/when Clause +Present Simple > Present Simple

If-Clause Main Clause Zero Conditional is used to express a general truth or a scientific fact.

First Conditional

If she does well at the interview, she will get a job. If you want to pass the exam, prepare for it.

If+Present Simple _____ Future Simple/Imperative

If-Clause Main Clause

We use First Conditional to express real or very probable situation in the present or future.

Second Conditional

If Lhad a good voice, I would become a singer. Do I have a good voice? Am I a singer? If Paul was not working today, we would go to the beach. Is Paul working? Can we go to the beach? If+Past Simple/Past Continuous a would/could/might do

If- Clause Main Clause We use Second Conditional (unreal present) to express imaginary situations that are unlikely to happen in the present or future.

If I were you, I would do

If I were you, I would stay in tonight. If was/were avould do We use this structure to give advice.

Third Conditional

If I had studied harder, I would have passed the exam. (Did I study hard? Did I pass the exam?) If I hadn't been studying that hard, I wouldn't have passed the exam. (Did I study hard?Did I pass the exam?) If+Past Perfect/Past Perfect Continuous would have Ved(3) If -Clause Main Clause We use Third Conditional (unreal past) to express imaginary

past situations, regrets, criticism.
