#### HISTORY OF CHRISTMAS

Christmas - a holiday, which in many countries has created a large number of symbols and traditions. These include even his date. • From Victorian England linked the custom to put gifts in the Christmas stocking. While telling a story that "Father Christmas" traveled through the air and penetrate into the house through the chimney. Going down in one of the houses, he dropped a few gold coins in a sock, which hung over the fire to dry. Since then, on Christmas Eve at the fireplace began to hang out "socks and stockings in the hope that there is a fall." And now, on Christmas Eve the children hung on the edge of the bed or fireplace christmas stockings to Santa Claus filled it with gifts. This tradition is gradually taking root in our country, in Russia.



## INTERESTING FACTS

- In the UK, home to decorate the branches of mistletoe. According to custom, once a year, on Christmas Eve, men have the right to kiss any girl, stop at the decoration of this plant. This happens not often, and not to waste time in vain, one man decided to decorate the branches of mistletoe mirror to be able to kiss all the girls stopped to admire herself.
- Dishes made with poultry (goose or turkey) are a traditional dish of the Christmas table in Germany and England. In England, certainly served at the table festive pudding, garnished with sprigs of spruce. In Western countries, the main decoration of the festive Christmas table was always festively decorated with a small herringbone.
