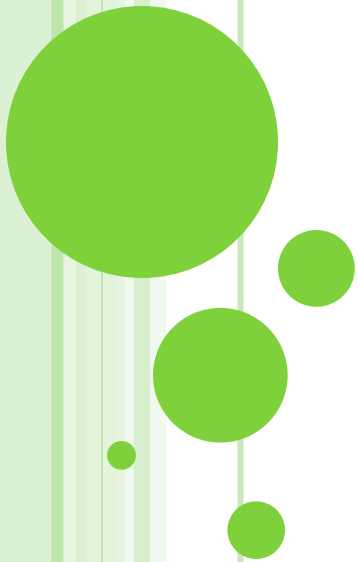


CANADA

- Currency – Canadian dollar.



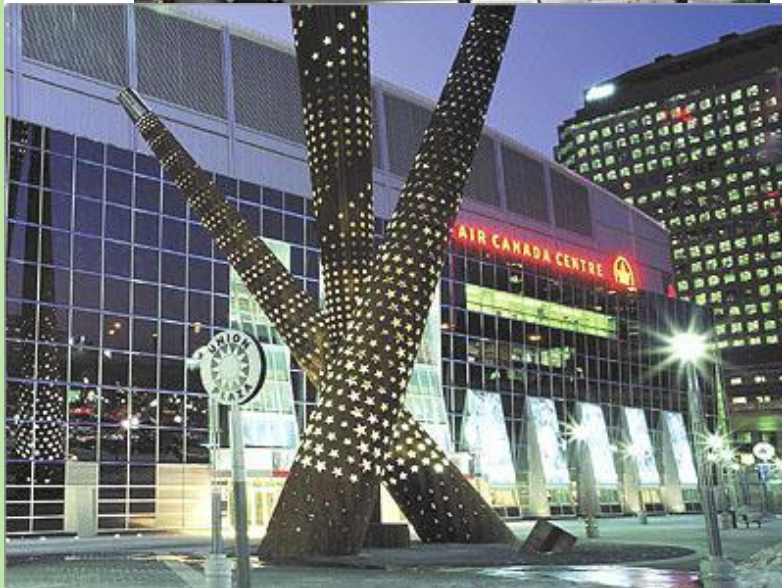
-

□ Australia has modern factories, highly productive mines and farms, and busy cities.

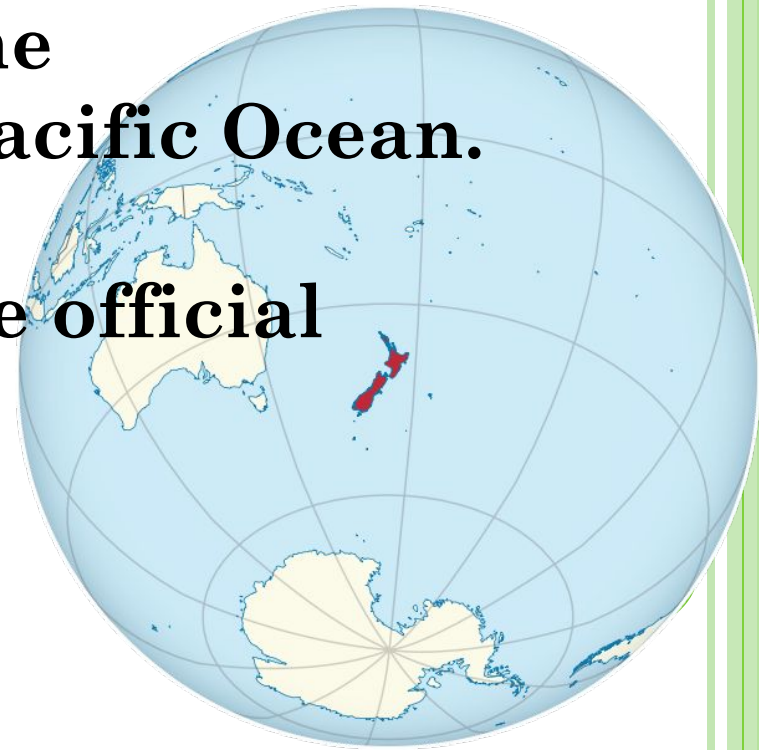
□ The most important trading partners of Australia are Japan and the United States.
