She followed Paul and Silas shouting, "These men are the servants of the most high God and are telling the way to be saved!"




She kept this up for many days until finally Paul become so troubled by it that he turned around and said to the spirit, "In the name of Jesus Christ, I command you to come out of her!"


At that very moment the spirit left her.

When the owners of the girl realized that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and took them to face the authorities.



The Jailer was commanded to make sure that they did not escape, so he clamped their feet in stocks.




The jailer woke up to see the doors wide open and he was terrified because he thought that all the prisoners had escaped.


He took out his sword and was about to kill himself when he heard Paul shout, "Don't harm yourself! We are all here!"




Trembling with fear, the jailer called for the lights and ran to the dungeon and fell down before Paul and Silas.
