Inclusive

An action which began in the Past and is still going on.

I have been learning English for 10 years.

! I have known her since childhood.

Exclusive

An action which was recently in progress but is not going on at this moment.

Why are your eyes red?
Have you been crying?
There are puddles everywhere. It has been raining.

*The bottle is empty.
Somebody **has drunk** the
lemonade.*

Present Perfect Continuous

An incompleteness, a process

*Somebody **has been drinking**
from this bottle. It's half
empty.*

To criticize or complain.

*Who **has been messing** around
with my papers? They're all
over the place.*
