


A Day in London




Gran (come) to stay. The children (man) to meet her. "Hooray!" (said) Kipper, "I love it when Gran comes to stay. She's good fun!"

Gran had promised to take the children on an outing. She (ammounced) that Nadim and Ann (count) go too. "I'll take you all to London," she (declared).






When they readed London, Gran factor the car. "Now we'll take the tube," insisted Gran. "It's the best way to get around."





Gran (takk) them on a boat. They (con)t under Tower Bridge. The children (takk) excited because the bridge (begin) to open.




It started raining and the wind (blow). Everyone (fett) cold. "Never mind," said Gran. "We'll think of somewhere warm to go next."

"and some of her grandchildren."


"She had lots of grandchildren,"

said Nadim.



"Help me. Pick the models up before anyone sees."


"Oh Gran," said Biff. "I let you out of my sight for a second, and this happens."




They picked the models up and put the heads back on.


"I don't know," said Biff. "I don't think they will let Gran in the waxworks again."
