Reported speech

Nikita said "I like art very much."

Nikita said he liked art very much.

We often move the tense of a verb one step back in reported speech because the original words happened before the reported speech:

original words reported speech *Tm sorry. I can't do that.' She said she couldn't.* present tense past tense

Original words	Reported speech
Present simple / present continuous: 'I'm going to the supermarket to buy food for the party.'	Past simple / past continuous: She said she was going shopping.
Past simple / past continuous: 'He went in to work late yesterday.'	Past perfect simple / continuous: She told me he'd gone into work late yesterday.
Present perfect simple / continuous:	Past perfect simple / continuous:
Tve had a terrible cold, but I'm better now.'	She said she'd had a really bad cold.
Past perfect simple / continuous:	Past perfect simple / continuous:
'I'd been having loads of trouble with my	She told me she'd been having trouble with

Will:	Would:
'My mother will water my plants whilst	She told me her mother would look after

Be going to + verb:	Was / were going to + verb:

In general, the *present* form in direct speech changes to the *past* form in reported speech: $am/is \rightarrow was$ $do/does \rightarrow did$ $will \rightarrow would$ $are \rightarrow were$ $have/has \rightarrow had$ $can \rightarrow could$ $want/like/know/go etc. \rightarrow wanted/liked/knew/went etc.$

direct speech \rightarrow reported speech

here \rightarrow there now \rightarrow then this/these \rightarrow that/those today \rightarrow that day yesterday → the day before/ the previous day tomorrow \rightarrow the next/following day next week/month/year → the following week/ month/year last week/month/year → the previous week/ month/year three days ago → three days before/ earlier
