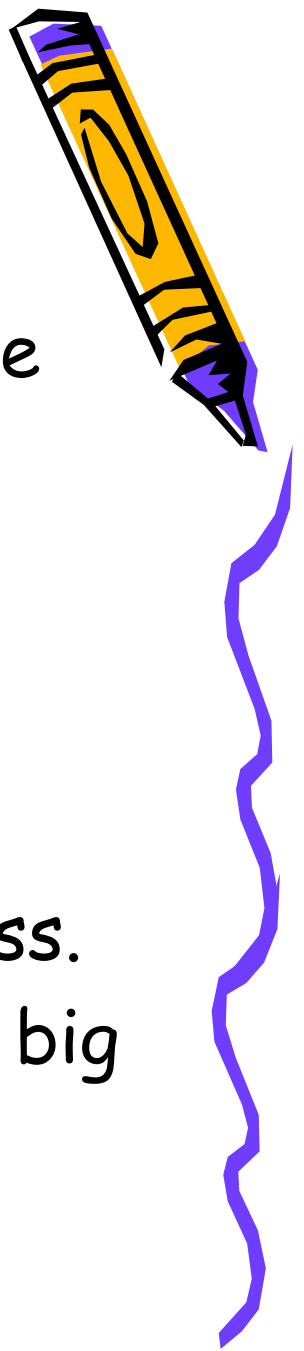
The King Fisher

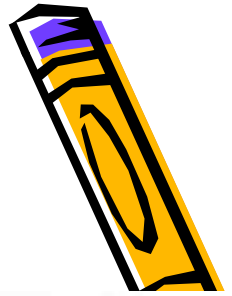
Idioms list

- ☐ 5. **Grin from ear to ear:** to give a very big smile.



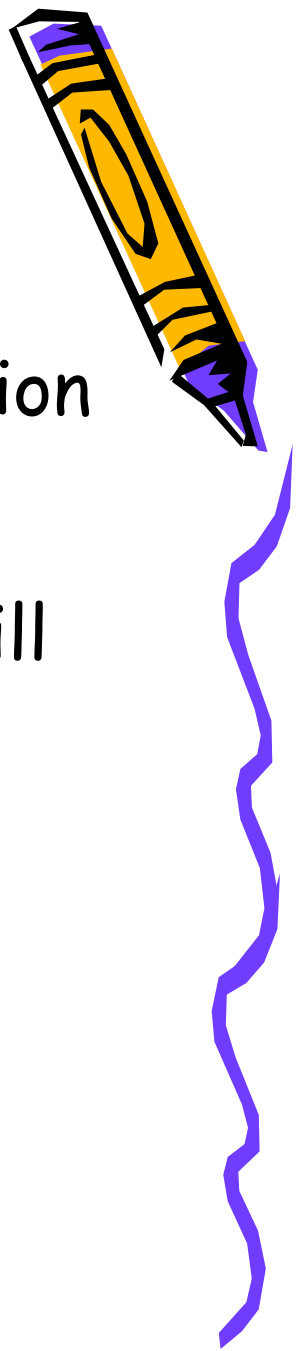
Riding to Work

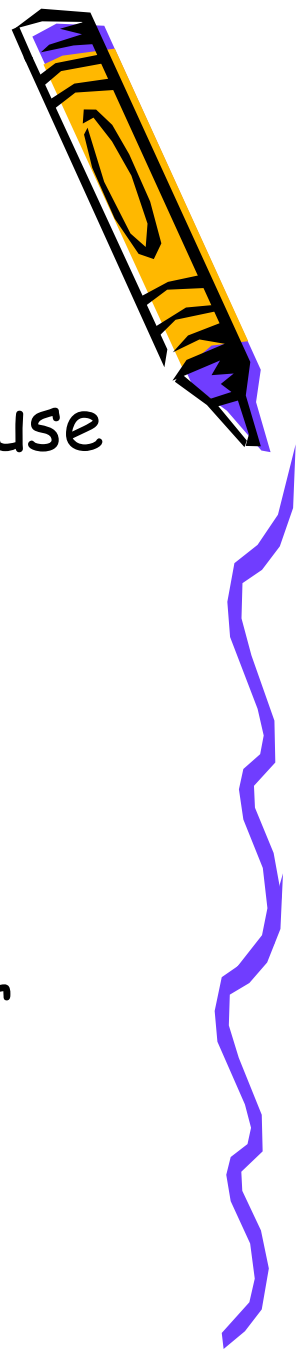


Late Homework
