## Presidential elections

- Plurality voting system: „The winner takes all!"
- Election of a party in form of electors
- Elected electors represent the opinion of their state in the "Electoral College"
- The narty with the most votes gets all the elf coral votes of this state -> The parties have look that they win in the states with a high amount of electors.


## Problem

- Parties and candidates try to get as many as possible votes in states with a high amount of electors and ignore the others
- The party with more than 270 electoral votes wins, though an other one has more vo s of the people in fact (f.e. Bush vs. ore)
