A Gallup poll for the day's Daily Telegraph puts the Tories on 48.9 per cent, Labour 38 and the Liberal Democrats 13.

John Major's own also had a 5.5 lead in the same survey last week.

Labour are set to be a short poll but The Times' poll also points ahead of the Tories after having a serious point last week.

As 8.38 pm for The Guardian shows Labour and Tories both on 48 points, with the Lib Dems on 10.

The same poll last week showed Labour first points ahead.

TENNIS CHAMP ASHE HAS AIDS

AND ALLAN HALL, in New York

TENNIS legend Arthur Ashe has AIDS, it was revealed last night.

The former Wimbledon champion contracted the virus after being found to be positive during a heart operation 11 years ago.

Ashe, 44, underwent surgery before revealing his condition to his wife, and adding pressure to his declining health.

Star

AIDS was diagnosed in last year and Ashe has been taking the drug AZT in an attempt to hold the virus at bay.

The star - born in 1943 into a Grand Old Opry family - is one of many 1980s people in America who died of AIDS after death contracted through sexual contact.

Ashe, married with a daughter and daughter-in-law, coached the players of the tennis team at the University of Virginia, and was a member of the Virginia Cavaliers in the 1960s.

Ashe, son of a Virginia politician, had his 40th birthday last year.

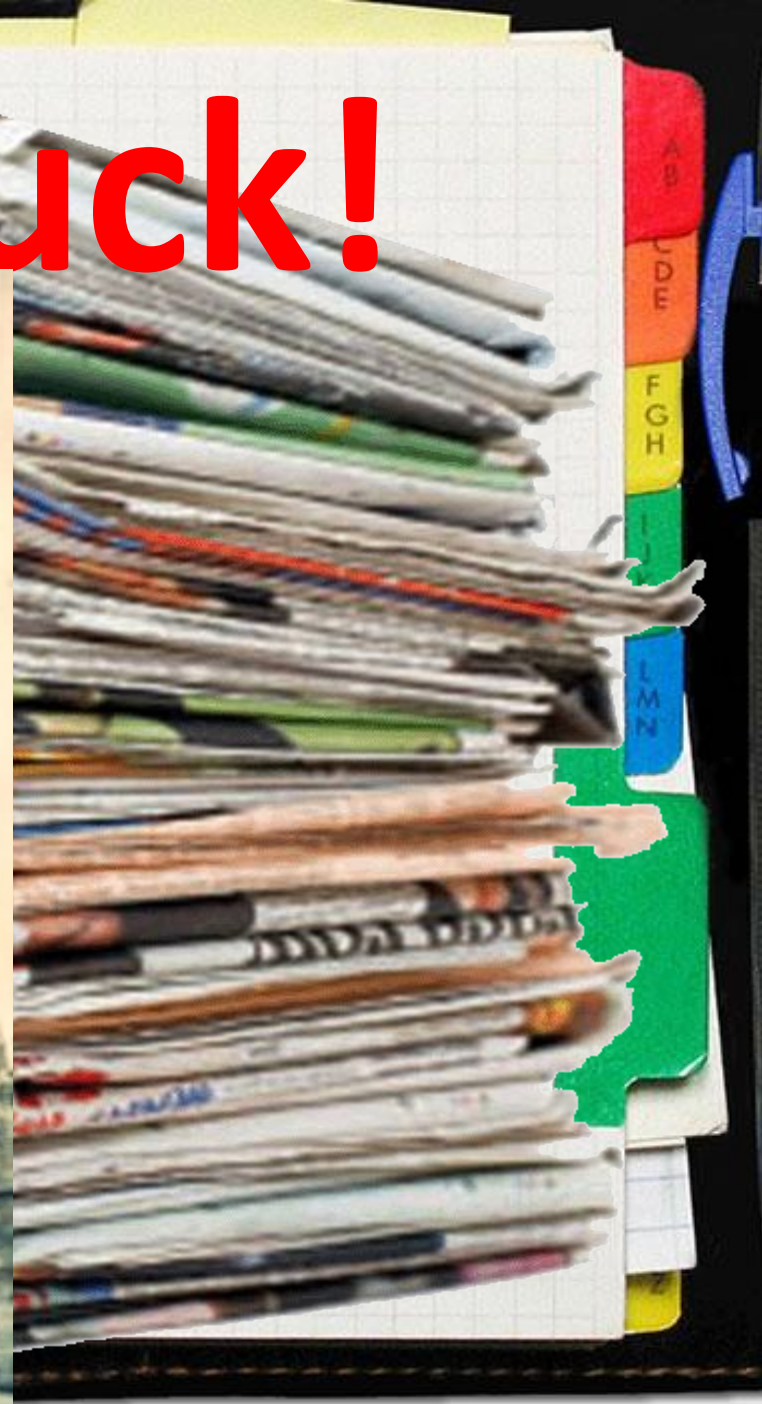
