Adverbs of frequency

- Lara **usually** eats lunch at about quarter past one.
- She **sometimes** goes shopping.
- Her father **often** visits her.
- Lara **usually** practices kickboxing.
- She **never** goes to bed late.
- She is **usually** very busy.
