





#### In the morning:

#### In the afternoon:

Have lessons, have lunch, do my homework, do sports, have a cup of tea

#### In the evening:

Watch TV, watch DVD, have dinner, do the shopping, listen to music, read books, play computer games, go to bed

### Adverbs of frequency

- Lara usually eats lunch at about quarter past one.
- She sometimes goes shopping.
- Her father often visits her.
- Lara usually practices kickboxing.
- She never goes to bed late.
- She is usually very busy.
