We've just passed Piccadilly Circus and now we are making our way to Buckingham Palace. It is the London home of the Queen. When the flag is flying on the top she is at home.

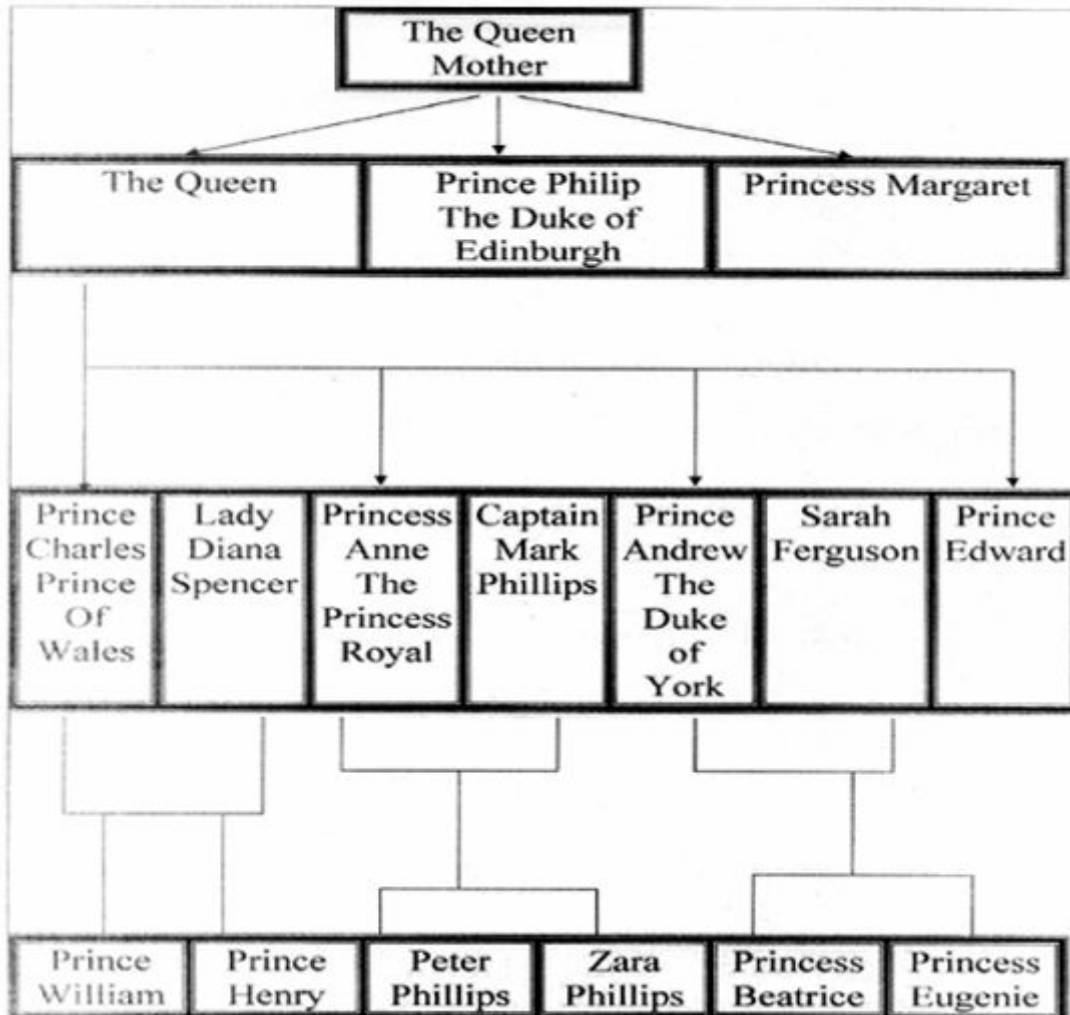


Look, they are changing the Guard!
