thing for the tribe.




The Prince ordered to build a fortress made of wood and the new settlement got the name of Yaroslavl and the emblem became the bear.

In 1463, Yaroslavl became a member of the Moscow State..




Many centuries have passed since the time. Yaroslavl has changed a lot.


Now it is a big industrial and cultural centre with a lot of beautiful churches, museums and a wonderful building of the local.
