When Zion was 2 years old, he lost both his hands and his legs below the knees due to sepsis infection.





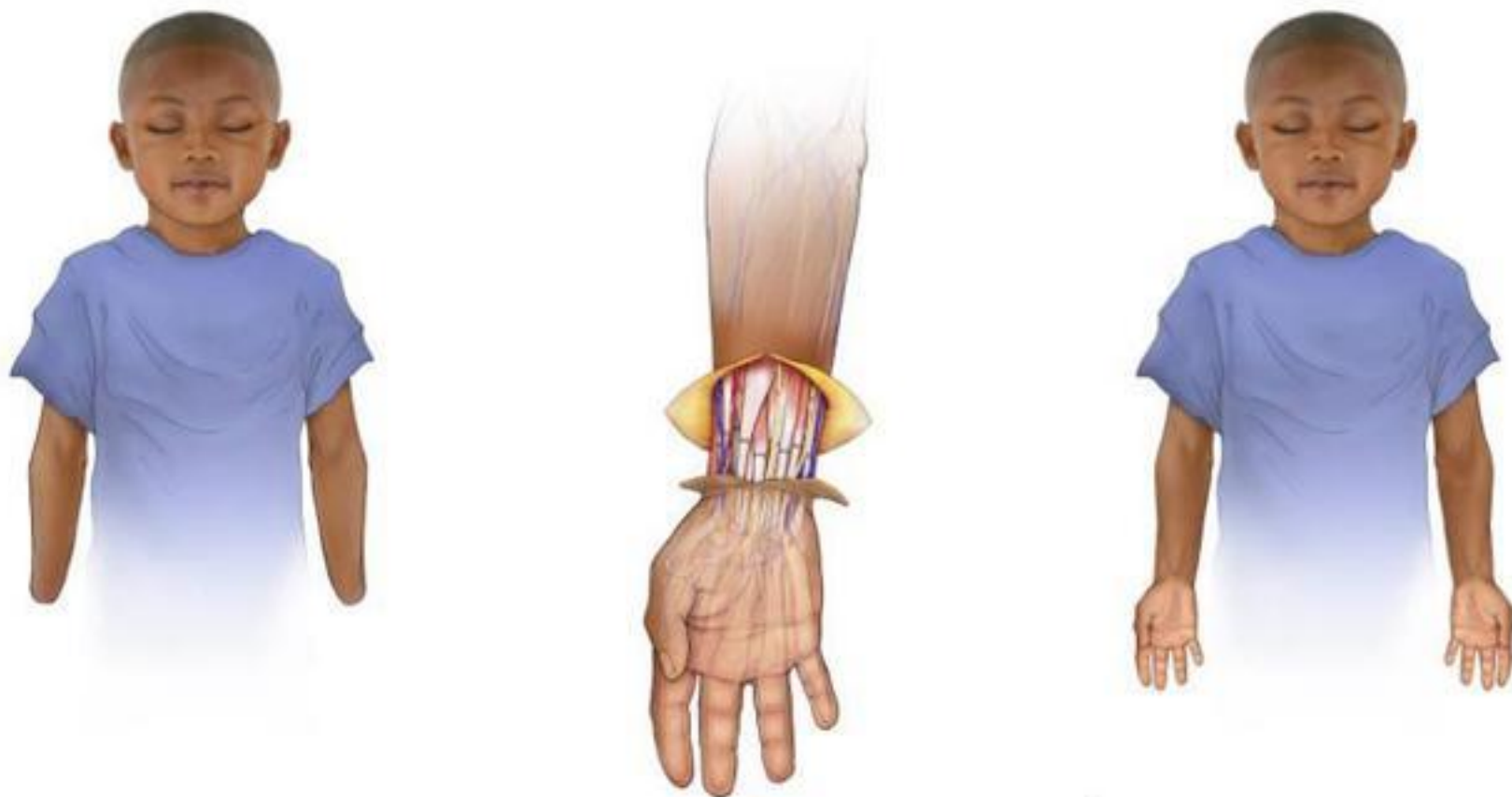
"Without my mom, I would not be right here right now. It's been me and my mom forever," said Zion.



According to available data, there were only 15 possible donors.

- **The surgery took nearly 11 hours**
- **The team included 40 humans**





Surgeons connected Zion's forearm bones to the donated hands, then arteries and veins, muscles, tendons, nerves.



The surgery was successful, but his brain had to relearn how to use his new hands.
