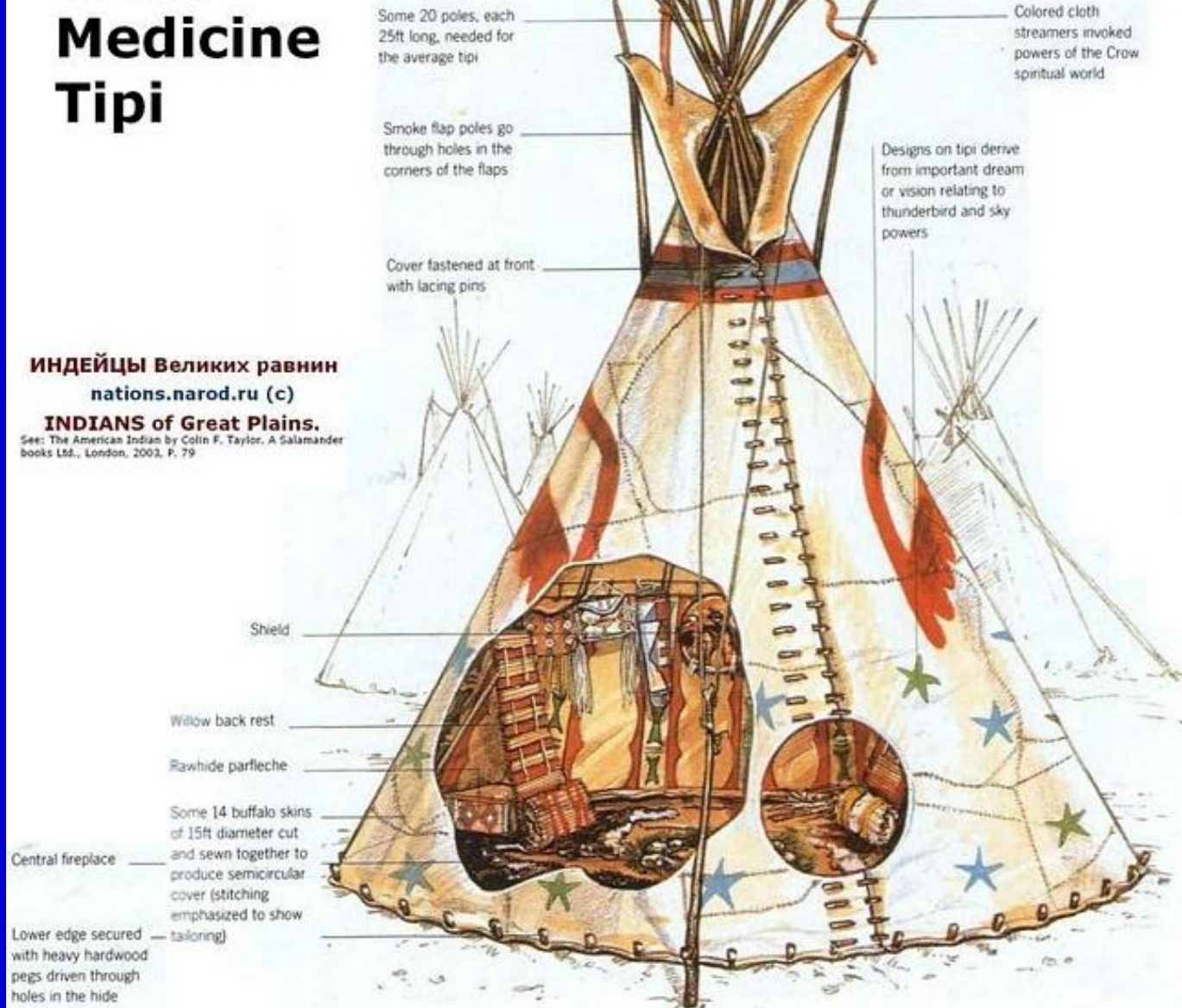

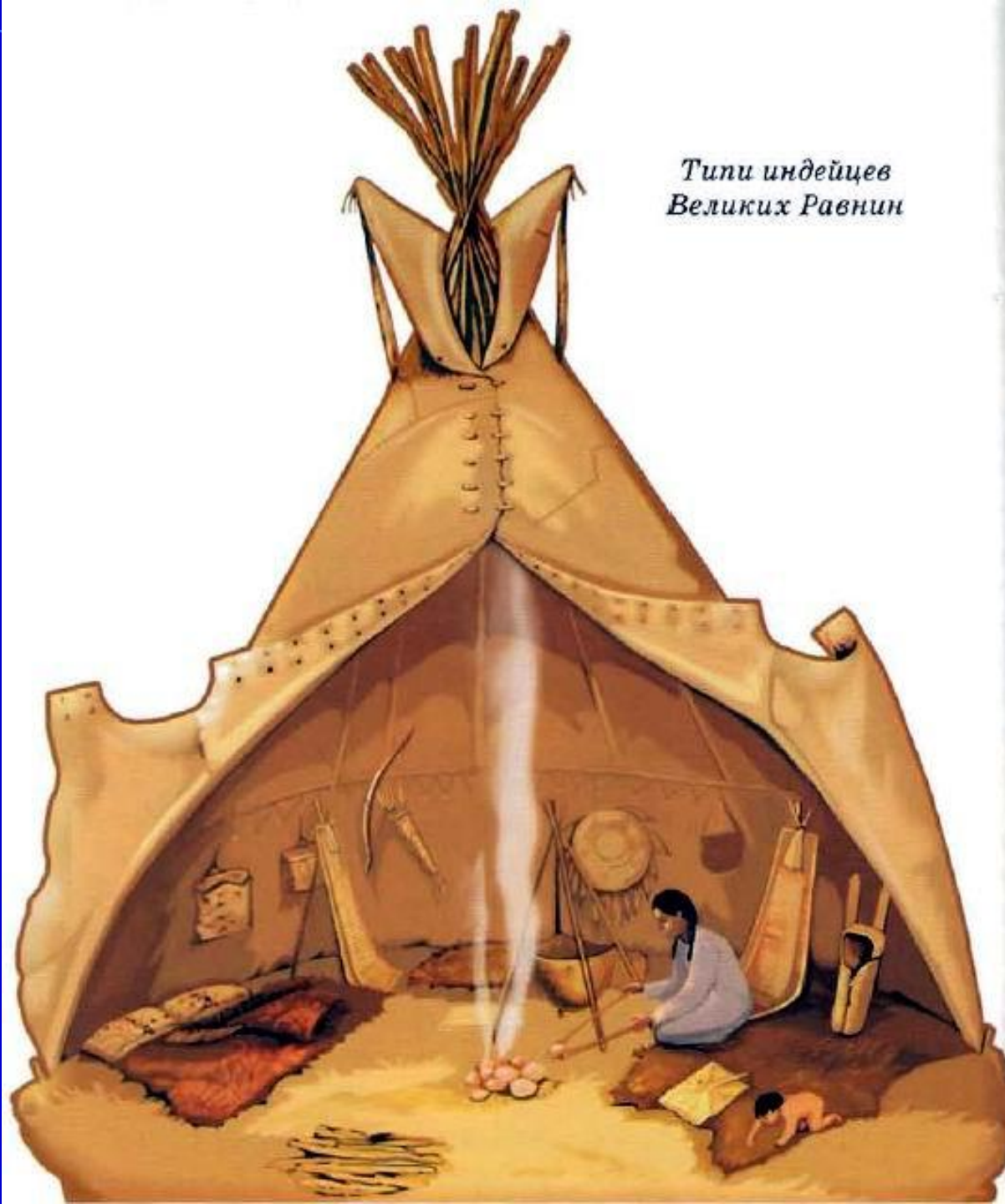

The skill and creativity shown by the weavers come from years of practice. Most weavers work on their rugs at home, while also tending to the daily chores of cooking, child care, going to the store, and herding sheep. The weavers have each worked about forty hours a week and are just in time to demonstrate their craft. The rugs they make are sold at the National Trading Post. All these weavers are well known for their excellent weaving skills and have won awards in ceremonies and rug shows.

Although many Navajo speak both Navajo and English, these women speak Navajo and very little English. Please direct your questions to the information desk clerk, the ranger on duty, or to the silversmith.
