





### Religion

Australia has no state religion. In the 2006 census, 64% of Australians listed themselves as Christian, including 26% as Roman Catholic and 19% as Anglican. About 19% of the population cited "No religion" (which includes humanism, atheism, agnosticism, and rationalism).

Australia consists of 6 states, 2 internal territories and 7 external territories.



In the centre of Western Australia and Queensland have hot summers and mild winters but Victoria and Tasmania can experience chilly winters.






The dry interior is hot year-round during the day but come nightfall it can become very cold. In the north, as the country enters the tropics.

### Canberra




Canberra is the capital city of Australia. With a population of over 345,000.

It is Australia's largest inland city and the eighth largest Australian city overall. The city is located at the northern end of the Australian Capital Territory.



As the seat of the government of Australia, Canberra is the site of Parliament House, the High Court of Australia and numerous government departments and agencies.





It is also the location of many social and cultural institutions of national significance, such as the Australian War Memorial, National Gallery of Australia, National Museum of Australia and the National Library of Australia.

### Sydney



It is the largest city in Australia and Oceania, and the state capital of New South Wales. Sydney has a metropolitan area population of approximately 4.5 million and an area of approximately 12,000 square kilometres.

Sydney was established in 1788 at Sydney Cove by Arthur Phillip. The city is built on hills surrounding Sydney Harbour – an inlet of the Tasman Sea on Australia's south-east coast.



It is home to the iconic Sydney Opera House, the Harbour Bridge and its beaches. The metropolitan area is surrounded by national parks, and contains many bays, rivers and inlets.






















The Great Barrier Reef of the northeast coast, the largest coral reef in the world, is threatened by increased shipping and its popularity as a tourist site.

# Blue mountains








Australia has been called "the land of differences" and "the continent of contrasts".

Kangaroos hop around and have pouches for their babies called joeys. An adult male kangaroo is called a boomer. An adult female is called a flyer.








### Koala
