

Relative pronouns and adverbs

Relative pronouns (who, whose, whom, which, that) and relative adverbs (where, when, why)

- are used to introduce a relative clause in the sentence.
- come after a noun.

Relative Pronoun	Use	Example
who	person (subject)	A vet who got the first prize is Russian.
whose	possession	That's the boy whose father is a famous writer.
whom	person (object)	The old woman whom I helped was Mary's grandma.
which	things	The book which he gave me is very boring.
that	things persons	A vet that got the first prize is Russian. The book that he gave me is very boring.

Relative Adverb	Use	Example
where	place	The camp where we first met is still our favourite place to go to.
when	time	That was the year when we went on holiday to Greece.
why	reason	The reason why she went is still a mystery.
