- **Sydney group «Easybeats» was the best Australian rock 'n' roll band of the 60s. The team was founded by people from immigrant families who moved to Australia after**



- **The structure includes two Englishmen - Steve Wright (vocals), Gordon "Snowy" Fleet (drums), and two Dutchmen - Harry Vanda (Gary Vandenberg, guitar) and Dick Diamond (Dingeman Van Der Slyuys, bass), one Scot (elder brother, Yangov brothers who play in the band AC / DC) - George Young (guitar).**



- **Infected with the virus, "British Invasion", the guys tried to extend it to the Australian continent, and it is great to have them out. «Easybeats» quickly gained national popularity when they took under his wing Ted Albert, owner of the largest companies on the mainland «J. Albert & Sons ». With it, the group signed a contract with «Parlophone» and with such strong support began to quickly gain momentum. By the end of 1965 in Australia already being ravaged «easy-fever" (similar to Beatlemania), and concert goers «Easybeats» fell into ecstasy.**
