Solicitors do a variety of work-corporate and commercial, litigation, property, private law, banking and project finance, employment law and environmental law.

There are about 66.000 practicing solicitors in England and Wales.





Practicing solicitors are consulted by, and receive instructions from, lay clients on a wide variety of matters both civil and criminal.

The barrister is the specialist with particular skills in advocacy, a consultant who will examine the case and decide what line to take in court.






The barrister will be reliant on the detailed brief prepared by the client's solicitor.

Barristers are self-employed in the independent Bar.



There are about 2000 barristers employed as in-house lawyers. A barrister who is part-time judge is known as a recorder.
